Our lessons together

Sewing lessons with me take place at my home in Ellerslie, Auckland.

They're 1:1 and are completely at your pace! Some students come to me with a little bit of experience on a sewing machine already, while others are completely new to sewing.

We'll have a chat about your current skills, confidence levels, and goals for our lessons and come up with a plan so you can get the most out of our lessons!

Sewing lessons Level 1 - Introduction

1.1
Introduction to sewing machines

In this lesson, students will be given a tour of a domestic sewing machine, its features, and accessories. Students will be given an opportunity to practice sewing seams and threading the machine.

Students will learn:

- To identify each part of a sewing machine.
- How to thread a sewing machine.
- How to sew straight lines, curves, and right angles.
- About different types of stitches and how they're used.
- About different sewing accessories and how they're used presser feet, needles, etc.

1.2

Introduction to fabrics

In this lesson, students will be shown different types of fabrics and how to identify them. The student will learn about how fabrics are constructed, and they will get the opportunity to cut fabric using different methods.

Students will learn:

- How to identify woven vs knit fabrics.
- About fabric grains.
- About basic fabric types and fibre contents (cotton, silk, polyester, etc).
- How to prepare, measure, and cut fabric.



Sewing lessons

2 Basic sewing projects

In this section, students can take on some basic projects using a sewing machine. Students will supply materials.

Options could include; Envelope back cushion cover, Wheat bag, Scrunchies, or Cotton face masks

Students will learn:

- How to cut out basic patterns.
- How to troubleshoot problems.
- Order of operations for sewing projects.
- ...and gain confidence using a sewing machine

3 Intermediate sewing projects

In this section, students can take on some projects using a sewing machine and overlocker, using intermediate techniques. Students will supply materials.

Options could include; Tote bag with pocket, Zippered pouch, Apron

Students will learn:

- How to cut out more complex patterns
- How to sew more advanced things straps, zippers, topstitching, hemming
- How to use an overlocker

Note: These sections do not necessarily correspond to one lesson each. Some projects will take more than one lesson to complete. Students can complete as many of as few projects as they like until their confidence grows.

4
Basic clothing

In this section, students will begin to sew some basic clothing items. Student will supply materials.

Options could include; Gathered skirt with pockets, Wrap skirt, Basic top, Loose fitting dress

Students will learn:


- How to read a pattern, including pattern notations
- How to follow more complex pattern instructions
- · he basics of garment assembly

5 Student's choice Using all of the skill they have developed in previous modules, student can more choose to apply there learnings to some more advanced projects.

Student may choose to select a pattern and be guided through their project by the tutor, or they may look at basic pattern draping or pattern hacking,
